### Consulting with Ken Pierce

He spent over a week in Dallas meeting with the GES staff, board, and me (Bob) to come up with suggestions to improve the ministry. He made the following suggestions:

- Hire someone to take administrative details from me so that I can devote myself more fully to writing, editing, and speaking.
- Hire multiple part-time people to head up different aspects of the GES ministry like publications, seminary, and podcasts. (We already have people heading up missions, YouTube videos, blogs, and foreign translations).
- Get a larger office to accommodate an administrator, one or more new part-time people, and a dedicated space for recording podcasts and videos.

These are exciting possibilities. But they will significantly increase our annual budget. At the August board meeting we will discuss which of these suggestions to implement first.
